Bir Raghab Moran

In the annals of medieval Assam history, among all the notable personalities, the name of Bir Raghab Moran is always remembered for his courage, bravery, leadership, and sacrifices for the sake of the Assamese proletariats. He played a very significant role in the Moamaria Rebellion during the reign of Swargadeo Laksmi Singha which was a spontaneous outburst of simmering discontentment against the exploitative nature of the Ahom regime. In various circumstances, Raghab Moran alias Raghab Neog himself faced a number of discriminations and hardships from the authoritarian Ahom administration. Kirtichandra Barbarua's physical torture and assault not only made him angry but also the entire Moamaria sect was thereby insulted. Besides, the religious policies adopted by the contemporary Ahom rulers posed a great challenge to the Moamarias. It made the entire Moamaria sect discontent and there grew a sense of hatred and dissension against the Ahom rule.

In this regard, Raghab Neog along with his friends and followers, remaining at the forefront organized and united the Moamarias against the mighty Ahom rulers to take revenge with a view to establish the Moamarias in a legitimate position in the feudal Ahom society. Subsequently, the Ahom rulers were bound to bow down to them which ultimately gave birth to the Muttock Kingdom. From this point of view, Bir Raghab Moran who used to be a popular leader from the Moran Community among the Moamarias, is still a hero not only in the minds of the Moran community and Vaishnavite Moamaria sect but also among all those who are looked down upon as downtrodden and ignorant in the entire Assamese Society. He remains in the hearts and minds of Assamese people as one the most remarkable cultural and historic luminaries of Assamese socio-cultural life.

COLLEGE PROFILE

Bir Raghb Moran Government Model College, Doomdooma was established by the Government of Assam on 7th March, 2020. With the central aim of improving access, quality, and fostering equity in the higher education scenario of Assam, the Government of Assam, in consonance with the centrally sponsored scheme of Model Degree Colleges, set about this enterprising journey of creating educational institutions catering to the higher education needs of underserved regions. Based on a nationwide survey of Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) or Gross Enrollment Index (GEI), Educationally Backward Districts (EBDs) were identified—districts where GER remained below the national average. Tinsukia is one among the 12 EBDs identified in Assam. Our college stands today as a successful manifestation of this spirited initiative of the Government of Assam.

In the more local context, our college has been instrumental in assuaging the severely disproportionate student-to-higher-education-institution ratio prevailing in the Doomdooma region. It is noteworthy that the name of the college, “Bir Raghb Moran Government Model College”, holds immense cultural and historical significance for the inhabitants of this region and Assam at large. In essence, the college name serves as a tribute to and immortalizes Bir Raghb Moran, a historic pride and son of the soil from the Moran community—an eminent cultural figure and historical luminary of Assamese socio-cultural life.

The cultural and demographic landscape of the region has deeply influenced the formation of our institutional vision, mission, and ideals. Culturally, the area features a rich intermix of ethnicities and traditions, inspiring our commitment to inclusive education and upholding the spirit of unity in diversity. This location also offers the institution a vibrant platform to showcase and nurture indigenous cultural knowledge among its students. Given the industrial predominance of the tea sector and a growing inclination towards entrepreneurship among students, the college prioritizes offering scientific, technical, and skill-based training that can equip youth with the capabilities to realize their dreams.

Although the college’s initial rationale was to rectify the imbalance in higher education access, our vision today extends beyond that goal. Alongside fulfilling the fundamental higher education needs of this region, our grand aspiration is to materialize academic excellence and build a state-of-the-art institution that will attract meritorious students from across the state. We aim to reverse the prevailing trend of educational brain drain and instead establish the college as a hub of academic vitality and opportunity.

Despite being a recently established institution, it is a matter of great pride that regular official UG classes began on 21st December 2020, with a high rate of student enrollment. While the classes are presently conducted within a temporary arrangement at Doomdooma College, efforts by the Government of Assam are underway to establish a permanent campus with state-of-the-art infrastructure, including spacious, tech-enabled classrooms, a modern library, and ample recreational and co-curricular facilities. Bir Raghb Moran Government Model College began its academic journey with a Three-Year Degree Programme (Honours) in Arts and a Three-Year Degree Programme (Non-Honours) in Arts, both under the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) affiliated to Dibrugarh University. Despite challenges posed by the COVID-19 second wave, the college swiftly adapted by organizing virtual classes and sustaining a vibrant culture of webinars, online competitions, and student-led programmes—a testament to our institutional resilience.

Now, in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the college has adopted the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) as introduced by Dibrugarh University, further expanding the horizon of academic opportunity and flexibility for students. The college currently houses 8 departments: Education, Assamese, English, Sociology, History, Political Science, Economics, and Mathematics. The faculty comprises individuals with strong academic backgrounds, teaching experience, and research contributions, as well as diverse skills including leadership, cultural engagement, music, and artistic excellence.

Our students are enterprising and driven, and even as the first cohort, they have exhibited remarkable enthusiasm, talent, and a deep commitment to learning—despite most of them coming from economically modest backgrounds. Their passion and untapped potential are central to our growth as an institution. We, the collective community of students, faculty, and local stakeholders, are committed to building this college into an institution of excellence, fostering educational access, socio-economic empowerment, and holistic development. Our shared vision is to transform this region into an educational hub, ensuring that the youth of Doomdooma and beyond receive not just education, but also the skills and opportunities for self-sufficiency and dignified living.

More than half of the time period of our maiden academic session had to be run from our homes due to the Covid-induced lockdown. We have not shied away from our duties. Our teachers have provided regular, interactive virtual classes to students and even managed quite successfully, the conduction of extra-curricular activities (contests, celebration of events, webinars etc). We had encountered a healthy admission rate and student turnout in the first ever round of admissions and with great confidence, we expect an equally exuberant student response in this round of admissions in the ongoing session (2024–25).
